

A Message from Cheryl Czach, **Executive Director**

As we wrap up Affirmations' 35th year, and my first year as executive director, we reflect on all we have accomplished in 2024 and the positive impact we have made together for the LGBTQ+ community.

This past year has been a year of growth for the center. We have expanded our Health and Human Services department to include additional capacity for therapy, introduced several therapy groups, and prepared for renovations to begin on our therapy suite thanks to Representative Haley Stevens who secured a \$300k Community Project Funding Federal budget allocation. This renovation will more than double our in-person therapy capacity. Knowing our current space constraints and the dire need for mental health services in our community, we added two new full-time telehealth therapists who can see clients based anywhere in Michigan. This would not be possible without funding from The Flinn Foundation, Sinai Medical Staff Foundation, and The Jewish Fund.

2024 also saw us focus on community building and program expansion. Our youth programming continues to evolve; we offered art classes, started a Youth Advisory Council, and Friday nights are the ever-expanding youth drop-in program. For adults, we have several new social groups: Queer Billiards, Fantasy Book Club, and our Fiber Arts Group. Our CyberCenter also received an upgrade: 6 new iMac computers thanks to a generous grant from the David Bohnett Foundation. Additionally, MIGen's new permanent space in Affirmations provides our LGBTO+ elders easy access to culturally competent senior programming and support.



As we have grown, the importance of diversifying funding is always top of mind. This year we secured 16 foundational and governmental grants, increased revenue from therapy services, introduced AFF GEMs-our monthly giving program, and welcomed many new donors. Every dollar goes to making our work possible-from paying the internet bill to supporting the Youth Leadership and Job Readiness program to assisting those with transportation needs with bus passes. Your support is a direct investment in the community center and our visitors.

Affirmations' mission has always been to create a welcoming and affirming space for the queer community and as we look to the next several years, that mission feels more important than ever. From the beginning, Affirmations was built by and for our community. We have held each other up in difficult times, celebrated together in times of victory, and affirmed our commitment to advocating for our equality. As we head into 2025, I invite you to continue your support of Affirmations and the LGBTQ+ community we serve.

Groups

Affirmation groups are intended to provide guests connection, support, and community around a particular issue or identity.

- Home to 23 support and social discussion groups
- 391 people per month attend at least 1 group at Affirmations
- 4 new groups began in 2024: Queer Billiards Social Club, Whole New Worlds: A Queer Fantasy Book Club, "Stitch, Please": Fiber Arts Group, and Crafts & Conversation: Adult Drop-in



Health and Human Services

From mental health therapy to care coordination, Affirmations takes a whole-body approach to our community. Whether it's our vaccination and STI clinics, group and individual therapy, health navigation, or monthly clinics that include a food pantry, name and gender marker change, free legal aid, housing, and financial literacy, we are here for you.

While Aff continued our Youth Leadership and Job Readiness program (45 youth served), we piloted and expanded into new areas:


- Youth Drop-in served 664 youth (ages 13-18) through November 2024
- · Piloted FREE art classes throughout the year with local artists and groups—serving 55 youths
- · Launched 2 new summer groups: Lavender Explorers and BIPOC Youth Empowerment
- Added a Youth Advisory Council to help lead Affirmations' youth programming in the future

16 grants were received this year


- 5 governmental grants from MDHHS,

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
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
